

## **New RSB office opens in the south!**

The Royal Society for the Blind (RSB) has opened a new office to service people who are blind or vision impaired living in the south of Adelaide.

RSB Noarlunga Downs will provide a full range of services, including occupational therapy, mobility training, and magnification aids and computer software to enlarge, enhance and even read aloud text for users who are blind or vision impaired.

Counselling services will also be available to support clients and their families in adjusting to vision loss, while a range of low vision products will be on display for demonstration and purchase.

Travis Little, acting RSB Southern Coordinator, says the new office will offer greater opportunities for assistance to those who are blind or vision impaired who live in the south.

“The new southern office will provide so much more space for counselling sessions, and allow social groups to be held on premises. We can also hold a larger selection of adaptive technology and low vision aids for clients to test and trial.

“We are excited about the ability to increase our products and services to people who are blind or vision impaired in the south” he says.

The official opening of the office will be held with a ceremony hosted by The Honourable Leesa Vlahos (Minister for Disabilities) at RSB Noarlunga Downs (58 Dyson Road, Noarlunga Downs) on Wednesday, 1 July 2016 at 9:30am.
